Making a difference and being part of something bigger than myself is necessary for my fulfillment. Throughout my life, I've enjoyed gardening, academics, and communing with nature and people. As a UF/IFAS Extension Agent for the past seventeen years, I combined these interests to teach Florida-Friendly LandscapingTM (FFL) principles to the public and professionals in the green industry and the built environment. I am writing to express my strong interest in the Urban Horticulture State Specialized Extension Agent II - IV and Florida-Friendly Landscaping Program Coordinator position.

Throughout my career, I have consistently demonstrated my ability to lead and inspire diverse groups while delivering successful programs and initiatives. One of my best qualities is being able to connect with people and lead them towards a vision which is a crucial skill for a statewide coordinator position. My leadership successes include realigning the 92-member Lake County Master Gardeners (MGVs) with the UF/IFAS mission of educating the public. I also led the Scenic Sumter Heritage Byway Advocacy Group, comprised of County government officials and employees, environmental consultants, owners of local businesses, and residents through the Florida Department of Transportation's Scenic Highway eligibility phase. While chairing the Lake County Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area (CISMA) Committee, I worked with multiple state and County organizations, such as the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission and Lake County Water Authority. Our committee expanded the CISMA to include Marion County, where it became the Big Scrub CISMA and still is to this day. These experiences demonstrate my capability to unite stakeholders with diverse interests in a common cause.

Over the years, my leadership skills have been consistently acknowledged within UF/IFAS, the horticulture field, and the Lake and Sumter County communities. I have been nominated for and completed prestigious leadership programs such as Lead IFAS, Leadership Sumter, and Walt Disney World's Great Leader Strategies, honing my ability to guide and inspire others. Serving as the Chair of the 3-year Review Central District Tenure and Promotion Committee, mentoring three agents, and leading initiatives like the Central District Green Team showcase my commitment to fostering growth and excellence within professional settings. Additionally, I assumed leadership roles in organizing and overseeing significant events, including the 2020 FACAA Mid-year Professional Improvement Conference and the 2014-2019 Lake County Landscape and Garden Fair. Furthermore, participating in County Commission-sponsored

meetings as a subject matter expert underscores my dedication to actively engage in community dialogue and decision-making processes.

I currently partner with a sustainable landscape think tank known as the OUTSIDE Collab in which nursery growers, builders, developers, professors from UF and UCF, extension agents, landscape architects, and municipalities are actively seeking and studying solutions to improve water efficiency and ecological services of residential landscapes. Within my extension role in this collaborative, I deliver educational research updates, participate in media events, collect data for applied research, and generate reports for grant funding. My activities in this arena directly benefit a Lake County nursery grower, soil amendment supplier, and the cities of Clermont and Groveland. This collaborative effort will influence the adoption of soil amendment, irrigation, and plant selection strategies for a master-planned community of 33,000 homes.

Not only am I able to see the big picture, lead, function as a team member, and redirect as appropriate, I am also able to drill down into the details to improve operations. For example, I was the first Master Gardener Coordinator in the state of FL whose program funds moved under the University's 182 account. While we transitioned to the new financial system, I developed local accounting and financial handling procedures and presented these to MGV Coordinators statewide. I also developed Greenhouse Standard Operating Procedures, which I presented nationally, and a Plant Clinic Manual to improve the communication and day-to-day operations of our Lake County MGV Program.

I offer a unique perspective that would be valuable as the FFL Statewide Coordinator in that I served in two counties and performed two different Extension Agent roles teaching FFL principles to diverse clients. From 2006 through 2022, taught by me or under my direction, class attendance totaled 27,967 residents, 6,137 youth, and 8,707 MGVs. Consultations provided by me and the MGV plant clinics via e-mail, phone, site visits, and walk-ins reached 31,012 residents or professionals. In addition, in Sumter County, I managed a one-acre FFL demonstration garden, a 71-member volunteer workforce, and 2 staff. In Lake County, I managed a four-acre FFL demonstration garden, a 92-member volunteer workforce, and 2 staff. While working at Walt Disney World, I performed the role of duty supervisor on Sundays, responsible for 10 interns.

I am enthusiastic about the opportunity to discuss how my experiences align with the requirements of this role. I have the experience and ability to implement processes, procedures, and curricula to unify Florida-Friendly Landscaping Programs across the state while allowing local flexibility.
